

This year is a very significant year as we will celebrate the Centenary of the formation of the Rotary Foundation in April 1917. The Foundation is our charity of choice and this year I encourage you all to make a special effort to help mark this 100th Anniversary.

End Polio Now

At the time of writing this message, there had only been 17 reported cases of Polio worldwide, 6 in Afghanistan and 11 in Pakistan. We are winning the battle and now the end is in sight. In 2017 we hope to announce the eradication of Polio but we will need to continue to vaccinate for a further period and after 3 years of no new reported cases, declare Polio eradicated from the world.

Partners Project

Barbara is planning a Partners Project this Rotary year. It will take the form of a PHD Research Scholarship in conjunction with Australian Rotary Health (ARH) in the general area of Cancer Research. ARH are currently calling for applications and in August we should be able to announce the agreed specific area of research.

Cancer touches each one of us through either family or friends and we are keen to continue research into this devastating disease.
